Imagine...the Terwillegar Market and Arts Centre

Your input will help define a new space to connect

e have just been offered a chance to dream and start a conversation about building something different, special, even un-heard-of in the park near the Terwillegar Recreation Centre. Imagine, if we developed an architecturally interesting structure that housed the all-year-long indoor Southwest Edmonton Farmers' Market. IMAGINE, if thoughtfully selected arts organizations resided in the building and programmed arts-based teaching spaces - giving Terwillegar Riverbend residents quick access to professional level arts instructors in theatre, dance, pottery, sculpture, film, the culinary arts and more. And just maybe, we could add on a modest not-for-profit local artisan retail space (like a mini Craft Council Shop downtown) and even a not-for-profit coffee house/bakery like *The Carrot* that hosts an intimate performance space for musicians, actors, writers in McCauley. If we were really visionary, we might add some artists' studios, community exhibition space, and definitely some community gardens...

The Oak Hills Community League has released an online survey for residents in Oak Hills and the greater Terwillegar Riverbend community. It is a golden opportunity to let the League and the City know that we'd like to see developed.

Whether we live in the suburbs, rural towns, or revitalizing inner city neighbourhoods the arts matter to all of us. The arts feed our imaginations and creative spirit, and link neighbours to one another in ways that make politicians green with envy and planning departments cringe. The arts cultivate place-making, identity building, and foster community vibrancy in ways sport cannot. Watercolor to aerial dance classes. Highschool musicals. Pottery and quilting groups. Storefront studios. Teen-painted murals. Choral groups. Battles-of-the-bands. Art on coffee shop walls. Art in Our Park Festivals. Cello solos. Paint-your-own-pottery places. It is all art, and it all matters to us and our community in ways we seldom acknowledge.

Slowly and subtly, the arts in some Edmonton communities has begun to establish a real sense of place and vibrancy - Strathcona, McCauley, Oliver (124 St), Bonnie Doon, and recently Boyle Street (The Quarters). But the arts' importance to enhancing the livability of suburban communities hasn't been included in most community league or city planning exercises as openly as it deserves. Housing, transportation, retail development, recreation centres and other facets of suburban development have received far more attention — while stereotypes about vapidity and uniformity in suburban Edmonton have been left unchallenged.

The significant positive economic impact that the arts can have on businesses, commercial and residential real-estate values has not been lost on Business Improvement Associations, select community leagues and select City planners. When united and housed strategically in neighbourhoods, artists and arts organizations build high caliber public programs where they reside. They build fantastic neighbourhood festivals and performances, and offer high-caliber workshops and classes. This is a particularly wonderful opportunity for our community leagues, as they struggle with resources, and cannot begin to compete with an arts organization in areas of specialty. It is for reasons of economic development, that St. Albert pours 3.4 million into their art and culture community annually. And, supported by the City of Edmonton in their efforts, it is for reasons of economic development that two very small arts organizations just received \$750,000 each from the federal Cultural Spaces Grants to renovate properties in Boyle St. The neighbourhood vibrancy these organizations will foster is undeniable and increase to property values definite.

Seduced by affordability, newer housing stock, and room for a growing family, it was with some sadness that I moved from Strathcona to Riverbend 16 years ago, believing that most people working in the arts or 'truly' connected to the arts lived in 'more interesting' neighbourhoods. To my utter shock, I discovered that my direct neighbour to the north was a full-time jazz singer, three houses down was a gifted painter, eight houses down a cellist and music educator, and across the street a gifted author and play-write who just won the right to mount a main stage performance at the FRINGE this summer. Furthermore, we just witnessed a group of amazing community leaders advocate and fundraise for the new Lillisan Osborne High School Theatre, not to mention our SW Farmers Market in the summer and our mini-folkfest "Art in Our Park" each September with 5000+ Edmontonians participating each year.

We are surrounded by neighbours who make a living in the arts sector and others who deeply understand the connection between the arts, creativity, health, well-being, and vibrancy (economic development). The key to vibrant placemaking in Terwillegar Riverbend starts with conversations with the SW Farmers Market, the theatre, the Art in Our Park participants, and our neighbours who are artists, artisans, writers, musicians, dancers, actors, designers and filmmakers. The Oak Hills Community League has reached out, and appears open to a magnificent vision of a place – a place to learn, a place to experiment, a place to share, and maybe, ...see page 2 from more..if we


Our motto is "Growing a Community" and we're always looking to add new members. We hope you'll check us out this year... and maybe burn a few calories while laughing along with us!



Now Let's Talk About Dirt

Wine Geeks Love to Talk About Dirt

hether we are apprentice sommeliers, or master winemakers, we all love to chat about how one soil favours one grape, how Kimmderidgean clay (composed of limestone, clay and fossilized oyster shells) offers the best quality for the chardonnay grape in the Chablis region of France.

The concept of the term "terroir" which was used by many old world producers is now becoming a more accepted idea from everyone in the wine business. In very general terms it means making wines that express the typicity of the specific vineyard site as well as seen as a route to improve quality.

So the question you may ask is, why? I do not have any degree in geology, and I hope that this information does not offend any expert out there (feel free to share your comments to my email situated below).

One simple reason as to why certain regions (or even vineyard plots) have been determined better than others, is that over time, winemakers (those early monks) have plotted through many trials and errors to find the best growing conditions for the grapes of the region. We briefly chatted about grapes in my previous article, so knowing whether to plant in alluvial or calcareous or even the famous tufa of the Loire is bound to provide results.

Remember that soil is a "balancing act" between the nature of the soil itself, organisms in the soil, water content and drainage. It plays such an important role in the development of the vine, the size of the grape and the amount of sugar in the grapes.

Today there hundreds of soils types identified for the benefit of winemakers and understanding how everything interconnects is paramount in creating masterpieces.

So next time you enter your favorite wine boutique, take some time to inquire how special that dirt is!

So here are three great examples of wines with three different soil types.

2014 Markus Molitor Zeltinger Sonnenuhr Riesling Spatlese-Mosel, Germany

A beautiful wine from the Mosel region of Germany, predominantly consists of slate, high in stone content and low in fertility. This leads to low nitrogen content in the must, which affects the yeasts metabolism during fermentation, creating different aromas.

2016 Gautheron Chablis Vieilles Vignes-Chablis, France

The unique soil in Chablis, known as Kimmeridgean (a geological age in the Upper Jurassic epoch, around 150 million years ago), consisting of gray marl which alternate with bands of limestone, sometimes very rich in fossils of Exogyra virgula, a small, comma-shaped oyster that is characteristic of the marl from the Middle and Upper Kimmeridgean. It is in this very particular subsoil, which in places breaks the surface, that the wines of Chablis draw their unique character, their purity, their sophistication and minerality.

2017 Lafage Nicolas Vieille Vignes Grenache Noir-Côtes Catalanes, France

Here is a fine example of what a blend of soils types can offer. Great example of the Cotes Catalanes sub district. The geological structure of Roussillon is very complex. The Pyrenees' movement during the tertiary period is responsible for a soil mosaic coming from schist, granit, gneiss, clay, limestone and gravel.

In addition the sun is very generous with more than 320 days of sunshine per year. The almost every day presence of Mediterranean winds and Tramontane (North-West) benefit the vines and slow down the maturation process.

I launched these awards in 2016 as a way to recognize the work and leadership of our youth in Edmonton Riverbend in response to the tremendous outpouring of support during the Fort McMurray wildfires. 



Engaging Citizens in Ward 9

Update from Your Councilor

reetings everyone! The following are some of the key things that we are working on at City Hall right now.

Residential Snow and Ice Control

The second year of the snow and ice strategy pilot project will wrap up this spring. While I voted against the continuation of this pilot project, Council's vote was 7-6 in favour of continuing it for the 2018-2019 winter season.



I continue to have strong reservations about this program. There have been reports about the use of the calcium chloride solution (also referred to as brine and anti-ice spray), and the potential damage that the use of this spray causes. My concern is not just with the spray, but with the significant increase in the use of salt overall as part of this pilot. While I understand the concerns regarding the use sand as an alternative, I think we need to have a more comprehensive discussion on the various snow and ice options available to us.

Administration is currently reviewing the way snow and ice is managed on neighbourhood roads, sidewalks and shared-use pathways. With ever increasing freeze/thaw cycles, the City needs to rethink the way these services are provided, keeping in mind the associated costs and benefits.

Your feedback on the use of these materials, and the general effectiveness of the program, will be important as this strategy continues to be developed by City Administration moving forward.

The Future of Waste

Last fall, Edmontonians shared their thoughts on how household waste is sorted and managed. Administration is taking that feedback to create recommendations for seasonal yard waste collection.

Over the summer, a pilot project across the east side of the city will explore the use of garbage carts. The current plan would call for one bin for organic waste, and another for other household waste. Depending on the size of the bin used, grass clippings would be permitted to "top off" an organic waste bin. These bins would be emptied by automated equipment on waste collection trucks. Administration is asking for your input to explore the details of what these changes might look like for the future of Edmonton's waste programs and services.

Bus Network Redesign

Edmonton Transit continues to work on the bus network redesign. Public consultation was completed earlier this year, and the revised network will be presented to Council later this year. Implementation is planned for the summer of 2020.

As part of implementation of the new bus network, Edmonton Transit will start several pilot projects to examine first km / last km solutions. These projects will test and evaluate different ways of moving riders between their home to the nearest bus terminal, and solutions may include ride-sharing technology, different "bus on demand" approaches, and the possibility of integrating private service providers into the public system. These pilot projects will be focused in areas that will not have regular service as part of the new bus network.

The Challenge of Finding Quality, Yet Affordable Child Care

Exploring Some of the Options for Families

very parent wants to ensure their children are left in safe and capable hands during the day, but for many the most daunting challenge is finding child care options that are affordable. A 2018 study by the Canadian Centre for Policy Alternatives explored this issue across Canada; according to their findings the weighted average child care costs in Edmonton were about \$895/month/child (\$975/mon/infant, \$870/month/ toddler, and \$835/mon/preschooler). For a family with two children in fulltime care, annual child care costs can easily exceed \$20,000.

The province of Alberta has initiated a pilot program to provide \$25/ day child care programs; this option is only available in select ELCC (Early Learning Child Care) Centres. There are currently 100 of these Centres across Alberta (82 are existing programs, with 18 more to be added in the coming months). This three year pilot project was launched in December of 2017, with year one evaluation results not yet available, so it is uncertain whether we will see a future expansion of this program in Alberta. Other supports like child care subsidy are available; however, many working families do not meet the income qualifications to receive it.

This is not a challenge that disappears once children reach school age. Before and after school care can be problematic for many parents, and certainly days that schools are closed (Teacher Conventions, Winter and Spring Breaks) can create daunting tasks of balancing work and care for children. There are not many child care centres that offer flexible one off options for these scenarios; typically a child would have to be part of regular before and after school care at that facility. Other options such as Rec Centres, Day Camps, Day Homes can be just as challenging to find and enroll in, and also expensive. Then there is an entire two months of child care needed during summer vacation to consider.

What is a family to do? There are options available that are both affordable and flexible, options that don't require long-term commitments. Family Futures Resource Network has several low-cost (prices range from \$40/day to \$140/week), day camp style options to meet the needs of all parents and families that struggle with this issue. From themed, week-long, day camps during the summer, to one-off day camps throughout the school year during teacher conventions and school breaks, they have something to help address these gaps in child care. 
