The grape du jour for red wine fans, and Argentina excels with this variety. This is a dark, brooding, oak laden version, crammed with plums, damson and mulberry fruits. Total taste bud domination. Cries out for beef, Alberta style or Argentina's famous "asado". Delicioso!!



## Back to school safety



Alberta Health Services EMS would like to remind parents and students about some road safety tips, as streets become more congested, with the return of the school year. Pedestrians and motorists both have an important role to play – road safety is a shared responsibility.

#### **Motorists**

- Avoid talking on cell phones, texting, or any other behavior that diverts your attention away from driving;
- Give right-of-way to pedestrians who have activated overhead crossing lights, or who are waiting to cross from a street corner;
- Remember, it is illegal to pass vehicles - other than those that are parked - in school zones or playground zones, during posted hours.

#### **Around school buses**

- Flashing amber lights mean a bus is slowing down to stop – motorists should do likewise;
- No matter which direction you are coming from, STOP, when approaching a school bus with activated flashing red lights – unless the bus is on the opposite side of a divided highway from you;
- Driver courtesy goes a long way. By simply being alert and cautious when approaching a school bus, you are contributing to school bus safety.

#### **Pedestrians**

- Cross only at marked crosswalks, or street corners that have clear visibility from all directions;
- Make eye contact with all drivers before crossing the street, and keep distractions to a minimum;
- When activating overhead crossing lights, pause before stepping off the curb to ensure motorists in both directions have come to a complete ston.
- Stay within the crosswalk lines until fully clear of the roadway;
- Obey pedestrian lights at intersections. Cross the street only when you see the 'walk' sign and only when all cars have come to a complete stop;
- If you are with young children or pets, hold your child's hand firmly and keep a solid grip on leashes when crossing;
- Remember: children learn by observing. By demonstrating safe crossing habits, you can reduce the chances of your child being involved in a preventable auto/pedestrian collision.

#### **Does Your Home Have Egress Windows?**

#### Read About The Requirements

Thether you're building a new house or renovating an old one, finishing a basement suite for aging parents or expanding it for children who have grown old enough to need more space, it is essential to remember the need for windows that can be used as an alternative exit in case of emergency, particularly if other routes are blocked. Government regulations such as the Alberta Building Code require that each bedroom and habitable basement have windows that provide an exit route from the house. The only two exceptions to this rule are if a bedroom has a door that leads directly outside or if a sprinkler system has been installed, otherwise egress windows are essential.

Because the purpose of the egress window is to provide a safe passage out of the house, it needs to meet several requirements: first, it must be large enough to allow an adult to fit through it; second, it must be located at an accessible height (no higher than 1.5 metres above the floor); and third, one must be able to open it easily from inside the house, without needing any tools. In the case of a habitable basement or a basement suite, these requirements may be complicated by the depth of the basement itself, and may necessitate the addition of a ladder to allow for safe egress. Of course adding a window large enough to perform its emergency exit function has the added benefit of allowing more daylight into what is typically a darker space.

Spring and summer are the perfect time for adding improvements to your home, but before you do, it is best to ensure that whatever changes you are planning meet the latest municipal and provincial regulations. Before you begin your renovations, please check out the latest regulations in the Alberta Building Code (Alberta Building Code 2014 Division B 9.9.10. Egress from Bedrooms), which can be found here: https://www.edmonton. calresidential neighbourhoods/documents/PDF/sleeping room egress window window well.pdf and confirm that your project meets all of the building codes and guidelines, while providing a beautiful and safe space for you and your family to enjoy in the years to come.



#### **Mysterious Barricades**

#### Cross Canada Concert for Suicide Awareness, Prevention and Hope

ack in September of 2016, I first wrote in The Ragg-Times of an adventurous and ambitious project that I was part of. - the Mysterious Barricades Concert Society's Cross-Canada Concert for Suicide and Mental Health Awareness. It was only meant to be a one-time event. Every year I have been writing updates and now we are now getting ready to hold the annual event again for the fourth year on September 14 at Convocation Hall at 4:30 pm.

Featuring many of Canada's finest professionally trained musicians and performers, many of whom called us of their own accord to see if they could be involved, this series of concerts raises awareness of the mysterious barricades that exist between mental illness and health, between the darkness of depression and the light of hope, between death and life. All of the concerts will be synchronized and broadcast as one continuous, globally live-streamed event. The past three year's events were deemed a technical marvel, running continuously and seamlessly for 18, 22 and 13 hours with viewers joining in from 48 countries. We are anticipating the audience to be even larger this year as concern over suicide as well as interest in the event continues to build. To our knowledge (and we certainly asked around), our concert was the first time a linearly synchronized, truly cross-country series of concerts had been performed and broadcast live in Canada. The event also received recognition and full-feature interviews on many major Alberta radio and television networks and even captured the attention of CBC Television's iconic program, The National, on which Mysterious Barricades founder, Elizabeth Turnbull, was interviewed. The attention received speaks to the importance the public places on the issue of suicide, as well as perhaps the innovative manner in which musicians are banding together to be part of the solution. The truth of the matter is, most of our volunteers are doing this out of love; love for someone they have lost, or almost lost; the love of beautiful music; the love required to be a good global citizen and be remembered for the kindness you showed to others. Those ideals in themselves, regardless of corporate sponsors or grants, will assure the future of this important initiative.


The quality of the musical performances in each of our Mysterious Barricades concerts has been, and will continue to be, exceptional. Many of Canada's professional classical choral and opera singers of the highest national and international artistic caliber have taken part, including Russell Braun, Tracy Dahl, and their contemporaries. Solo performances through to 50-voice choirs have graced our stages. Each year has involved more than 150 musical performances and the participation of more than 300 performers. We are now being contacted on a regular basis by performers asking us to allow them to give of their time and talent to perform in our event.

This last year, Kelowna was added to the list of concerts which include St. John's, Halifax, Sackville, Montreal, Ottawa, Toronto, London, Kitchener/Waterloo, Winnipeg, Saskatoon, Edmonton, Calgary, Vancouver and Victoria. The livestream ensures that all Canadians, if they so wish and have access to the Internet, will be able to participate in this event and reap the benefits of the music as well as the access to important resources made available throughout the day. The livestream will be available on our website at: http://www.mysteriousbarricades.org/.

Contrary to public perception, figures from Statistics Canada indicate that middle-age and older Canadians are at significantly higher risk of suicide than those below 40 years of age. We also target university students, because we know that they too are affected by mental health issues: their struggles, and the struggles of others of a similar age often make headlines. We also believe that they, as a generation, are motivated to make positive change for our collective future. Therefore, to date almost all of our concerts have been held on university campuses, places where the suicide rate is of particular concern. In 2019, 14 of our 15 concerts will be held on university campuses. University Mental Health Services are on-site at each University concert venue, along with Canadian Mental Health Association staff, to provide information and support for attendees.

Over the past three years approximately 3800 people have attended the Mysterious Barricades live events and listened to mental health and suicide prevention speeches as outlined above. Attendees were also provided with information and support from our professional mental health and suicide prevention partners' personnel. 11,000 people have viewed the livestream which includes all of the mental health speeches. Our 2019 venues range from intimate environments to large concert halls; our total capacity for the 15 live concerts this year exceeds 4500 audience members. We focus our efforts on promotions and marketing to ensure that our venues will be full and that the messages from our speakers reach as many individuals as possible.

Each and every concert – 41 over three the previous years, and 15 more in 2019 - has been free to attend. All of the performers have given of their time and talents to participate; concert have freely welcomed anyone who has wished to attend. It is free to attend and enjoy but it certainly isn't free to run this event. Even



though we get a lot of venues for free, there are still technical costs involved in creating such a project. Please consider a donation to help us. We have applied for and are waiting for charitable status, but we can't give tax receipts yet and may not before this year's concerts. I am the treasurer for Mysterious Barricades so fund raising is near and dear to my heart.







#### **Trustee Talk**

#### Our Children Need YOU. Won't YOU be My Neighbour?

ast September, I organized a special back-to-school volunteer appreciation screening of "Won't you be my neighbour?" a 2018 documentary of Mr. Fred Rogers (now available on Netflix). There was not a dry eye in the theatre and you'll understand immediately the connection between this program, public education,



and the call to action for our neighbourhood.

Unlike anyone on television, he spoke to children directly as small adults. His show dealt with serious adult issues like the assassination of a President and helped a generation of children grapple with trauma-- always with compassion and love. In many ways, Fred Rogers is my favorite rebel of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. He communicated anti-racism against segregation, pacificism against the war in Vietnam, and protected children against rampant consumerism treating them as mere pathways to parental wallets.

But his greatest message of all? Love. Love for your neighbour. His song "it's you I like" reminds each child they are intrinsically special and worthy of love and respect, a message critical for all of us to hear in our own hearts and model to each young person we meet.

As we look ahead to the school year, let all of us model that spirit of Mr. Rogers in our neighbourhoods, playgrounds, and parks. We have to look out for one another. There is no such thing as other people's children. We are one big neighbourhood.

Mr. Rogers cautioned us to always look for the helpers. How are you a helper? According to End Poverty Edmonton's Poverty Profile 2019, 1/10 or 119,950 Edmontonians are experiencing poverty (including 9,705 lone parent families). According to the Alberta Mentoring Partnership, there are over 3000 young people waiting for a mentor—a caring adult just like you. Strong developmental relationships to wrap around young people are just as essential to breaking the cycle of poverty.

Become a Mentor, a reading volunteer, or a coach. You can make an enormous difference in the life of a young person, in some cases for as little as one hour a week.

In a media world telling us to fear, Mr. Rogers told us to love. Get involved and spread the love.




